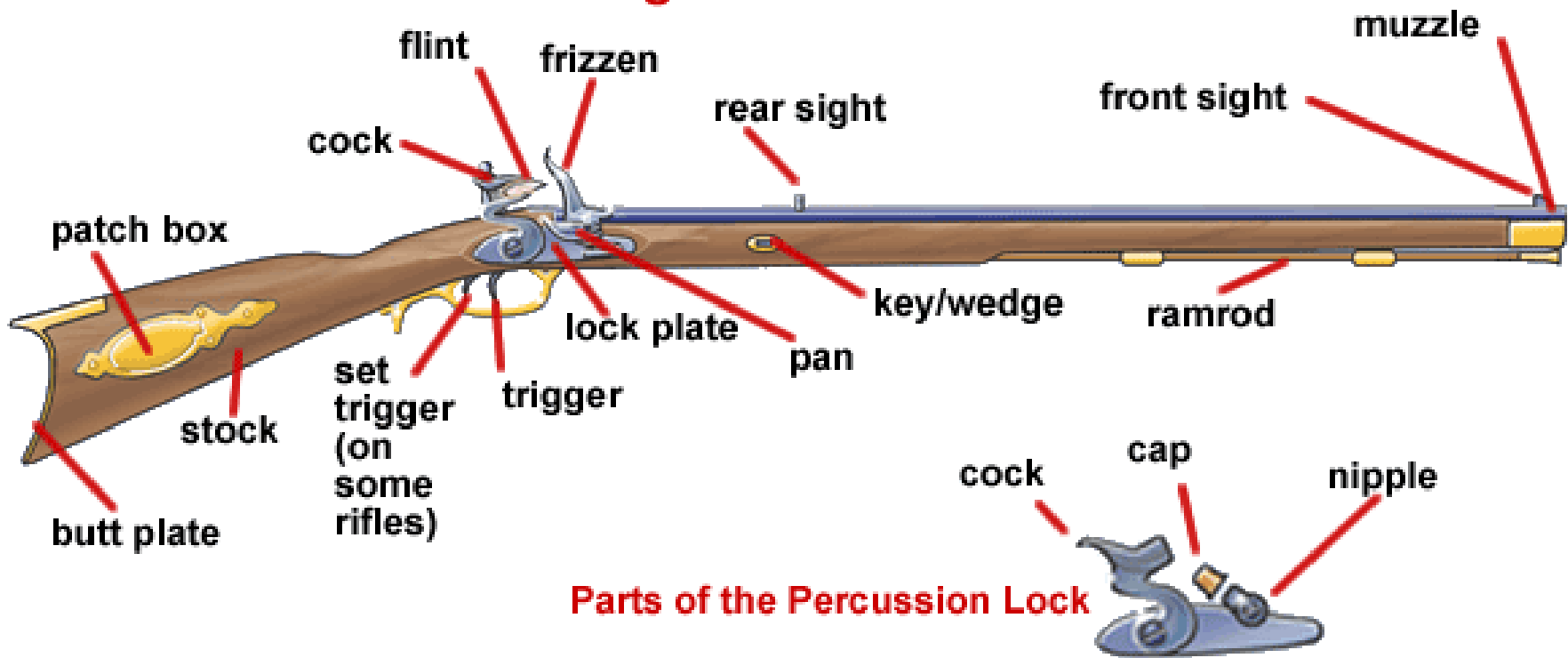
Parts of a Muzzleloading Flintlock Rifle



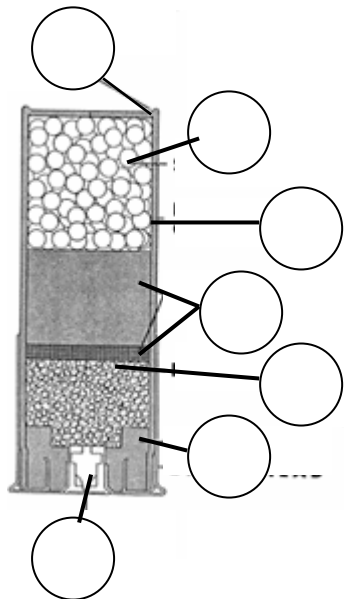
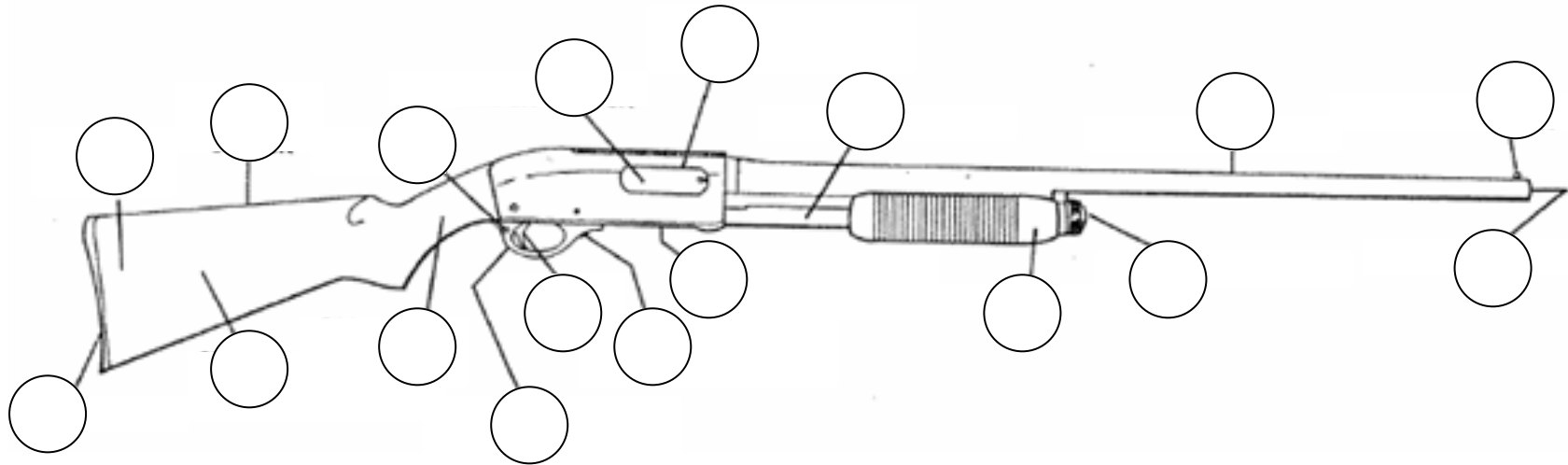
